This day came the parties by their Attorneys and the Commissioners appointed to make
division of the property &c in the foregoing mentioned this day made the following report
to wit: In obedience to an order of the County Court of Southampton to us directed in
hearing date November Court 1819. We the undersigned have proceeded to carry into
effect the annexed order by attesting to Joseph T. Claus in right of his wife Elizabeth
the following negroes to wit Anthony and Dick supposed to be worth eight hundred
and fifteen dollars which we think to be ~~one~~ sixth part of the slave in the said
order mentioned. Also two sows and pigs supposed to be worth eighteen dollars. Two
cows and calves worth twenty two dollars. One horse worth one hundred and twenty
dollars also one feather bed and furniture worth twenty seven dollars and fifty cents
All of which is humbly submitted. December 18th 1819. Jas. Harris, Arthur Williamson
Milla Francis. On consideration whereof it is decreed and ordered that the report
aforesaid in form aforesaid made be confirmed -

Benjamin Cobb, Jeremiah Cobb, John T. Shaw, Henry Melch and Thomas Fitzhugh
Trustees of the Hatteray and Mansfield Tracts of Indians came into Court and with
Richard Blunt Henry T. Mayet and Alexander T. Putt their securities entered into and
acknowledged their bond in the penalty of twelve thousand dollars conditioned as the
Law directs -

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till to morrow morning 9 o'clock
