 taining thirty nine acres to William Stephenson who is to receive four dollars and eleven
 cents. And after advertising the same and place for three weeks previous, we have further
 proceeded to sell, to the highest bidder, on a credit of twelve months, one negro man slave
 belonging to the Estate of William Stephenson dec^d William Stephenson became the purchaser
 for the sum of three hundred and thirty eight dollars - We have deducted therefrom the
 sum of fifteen dollars for our Commissions for selling the same and dividing the land
 leaving a balance of three hundred and twenty three dollars, for which we have taken
 five separate bonds for each four dollars and sixty cents each, and passed one of said
 bonds to William Stephenson one other bond to Peggy Stephenson, one bond to Jeremiah
 Stephenson, one other bond to Benjamin Bondler Guardian to James Stephenson, and one
 other bond to said Bondler as Guardian of William L. Stephenson - Given under our hands
 this 26th day February 1820. Elias Sumnerell, James Clayton Herod Sumnerell. Whereupon
 by consent of the parties, it is ordered that the said report be confirmed -
