Myrick infant of David Myrick dec'd land, to wit, Beginning at a small red oak a new corner made in the dower line and in Joseph Harris line thence due West 16 pole thence N 47 W 8 pole thence N 60 W 12 pole to a pine a corner of Joseph Harris and the Myrick tract of land: thence S 7 W 28 pole S 26 W 20 pole thence S 13 W 40 pole to a large white oak on the side of a path opposite Joseph Harris' orchard thence S 20 W 94 poles thence S 31 W 8 poles thence S 13 W 20 pole thence S 7 W 76 poles thence S 3 E 40 poles thence S 16 E 34 poles to a large Over cup oak a c. of Joseph Harris thence N 72 W 6 pole to a paper gum a corner in Joseph Harris line standing on the side of the creek thence N 82 W 56 pole up the creek to where ought to be a corner in the intersection of the creek and the marked line: that turns from the creek to go to Meherrin river thence S 6 E 232 pole to a large white oak on the bank of Meherrin river a c. of Joseph Harris - thence up the said river the various courses thereof to an Elm a new corner made in the dower line thence along the dower line N 3 W 140 pole to a Horn beam - a new corner made in the dower line, and on Susan Sundry's line, thence N 67 W 26 poles to a white oak a corner of Susan Sundry & Joseph Harris, thence N 77 E 90 poles, thence N 56 E 24 pole to a sweet gum c. of Susan J. Sundry standing on the side of the swamp thence up the said swamp the various courses thereof to the Resting ear Branch; thence up the said branch the various meanders thereof to a c. of Edwin Sundry at his crop fence: thence due West 46 poles to a dead oak a c. of Edwin Sundry standing in his corn field and a new corner made in the dower line thence along the dower line N 87 E 118 pole to the first station containing 427 acres including the high land and the low land, both inclusive as they meet together, being her proportionable part of the lands of David Myrick dec'd exclusive of the Widow's dower right James lines C. S. Oct 1st 1819.

"In obedience to a decree from the Worshipful Court of Southampton to us directed we have made the division of the lands of David Myrick dec'd agreeable to the above dimensions to wit Dower in upper land one hundred and seventy nine acres, dower in low grounds sixty five acres Given under our hands this 11th day of July eighteen hundred and twenty - Arthur Williamson, Joseph Williams, Joseph Harris."

On consideration whereof and by consent of parties it is decreed and ordered that the report aforesaid in form aforesaid made be confirmed. And the costs equally borne between the parties.
