At a Court summoned and held for the County of Southampton at the Courthouse on the 16th day of August 1820 for the examination of Nicholas Faircloth who stands charged with Feloniously stealing taking and carrying away a Virginia Bonds note of five dollars, belonging to one Sylvia Bryant as or about the 29th or 30th day of July 1820-

The Court being thus constituted the Prisoner was set to the Bar by the Sheriff of this County into whose custody he was heretofore committed, and charged with the felony aforesaid and thereupon divers witnesses were sworn and examined on behalf of the Commonwealth touching the premises to wit, Sylvia Bryant, Thomas Bryant, James Gray Jr, Belah Edworthy, James A. Barham and Anthony Woodward, and the prisoner being fully heard by Council the Court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the prisoner ought to be tried for the said offence at the next Superior Court of Law to be holden for this County and thereupon he is remanded to jail.

Be it remembered that Sylvia Bryant, Thomas Bryant, James Gray Jr, by their next friend Sylvia Bryant, Belah Edworthy, James A. Barham and Anthony Woodward here in Court severally acknowledged themselves indebted unto his Excellency Thomas M. Randolph Esq Governor or Chief Magistrate of this Commonwealth in the sum of \$333.33 1/3 cents of their respective goods and chattels lands and tenements and to be paid and to our said Governor and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth rendered Yet upon this condition that if they the said Sylvia Bryant, Thomas Bryant, James Gray Jr, Belah Edworthy, James A. Barham and Anthony Woodward shall personally appear before the Judge of our Superior Court of Law of Southampton County at the Courthouse on the first day of the next Superior Court to be holden for this County by 10 o'clock of that day then and there to give such testimony as they and each of them know or believe to be true on behalf of the Commonwealth against Nicholas Faircloth who stands charged with larceny and shall not depart thence without leave of the said Court then this recognizance to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue.

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 19th day of August 1820 in pursuance of an Act of Assembly entitled "An act to explain and amend an Act respecting into one the several Acts concerning Forcible entries and detainers passed the 12th day of February 1814." Present, Jeremiah Cobb and James Myrick Just.

It appearing that the said warrant hath been duly executed according to the provision of the above recited act of Assembly and that Jeremiah Cobb, Benjamin Drew, James D. Mapenbury and James Myrick four Justices of the Peace for the County have been duly notified as required by the said Act, and also that eighteen good and lawful men freeholders have been summoned as required by the said Act. It is ordered that a Jury of twelve to be selected by lot from the said freeholders. Whereupon a Jury selected by lot to wit, John Hester, William Syner, Edmund Dick, August Edwards, William Deale, David Doyal, John Moore, Henry McLaughan, James Powell, Patrick Dole, Howell Brower and Thomas E. Early who sworn as the Law requires returned a verdict in the following words to wit. "We the Jury find that the defendant did at the time of the exhibition of the complaint filed in this cause hold possession of the tenement therein mentioned against the claim of
