Pursuant to an order and decree of County Court of Southampton a copy whereof is hereto annexed, we Simon Morfee, Hope Parker, and Wells Murfee, three of the Commissioners in said decree named have set apart and allotted to Sally Hart one third in value of the lands of which Richmond Dillards (her late husband) died seized lying in the said County of Southampton including the Dwelling house by the following metes and bounds to wit - Beginning at an apple tree a new corner made in the Windows dower, near the house, on the side of the crop fence, thence at 80
