 his deceased father - Also Lotta No 4, drawn by Joshua Ambler containing 263
 acres and bounded as follows, to wit, Beginning at a red oak on the side of the road
 near Majr Drury's fence thence N 40 E 32 poles to a pine a c. of Majr Drury thence
 S 68 E 18 pole to a pine c. of Majr Drury thence N 44 E 50 poles thence
 N 46 E 60 poles thence N 7 E 36 poles to a pine c. of Majr Drury, N 17 W 124 poles to a
 red oak a c. of Majr Drury at Mr Hearn's fence, thence N 83 W 120 poles to a red oak
 a c. of Majr Drury near the road, thence N 81 E 34 pole to another red oak c. of
 Majr Drury where his point of land comes in, thence due North 89 poles to the cr.

 having reference to the plat accompanying this report by traversing each Lotta

 their Attornies it is denied and ordered that the report aforesaid in favor aforesaid
 made be confirmed and the costs equally borne between the parties -

The Commissioners appointed to view the conveniences and inconveniences that will
 result by turning the road through the plantation of George Branch as proposed by him
 this day made the following report to wit "Agreeable to an order of the County Court
 of Southampton bearing date November Term 1819 we have viewed the conveniences &
 inconveniences which will result to the Public as well as to individuals, by turning the
 road as proposed and do report as our opinion, that the turning the said road will be
 a considerable convenience to George Branch, and no inconvenience to the public or to any
 other individual whatever. Given under our hands this 16th day October 1820.

 have leave to turn said road as is petitioned for -
