Drumy Bille who is charged in writ by Quincy Porter a free white woman with being the father of her bastard child and who entered into a recognizance for his appearance here this day and is abides and performs such order as the Court should make concerning the same, appeared accordingly, and the said Quincy Porter being sworn and examined and the said Drumy Bille fully heard this Court upon the whole circumstances of the case, doth adjudge the said Drumy Bille to be the father of the said bastard child and that the said child is likely to become chargeable to this County. Therefore it is ordered that the said Drumy Bille be charged with the annual payment of \$30 to the Overseers of the Poor of the said County for the space of seven years from this day in case the said child should live so long and that the said Drumy Bille pay the same to them accordingly at the expiration of every year until the expiration of the said seven years, and thereupon Drumy Walter Guardian of the said Drumy Bille came into Court and acknowledged himself indebted to Thomas M. Randolph Esq. Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia in the sum of one hundred and forty dollars of their respective goods and chattels lands and tenements to be levied and to our said Governor and his successors for the use of the Commonwealth recorded. Yet upon this condition, that if the said Drumy Bille shall observe and perform the above order of the Court against him as aforesaid then this recognizance to be void -
