Exam Eley having obtained an attachment against the estate of Mills M. Eley who hath privately removed out of this County or so absconded or concealed himself that the ordinary process of Law cannot be served upon him and Jesse Bailey Constable having made return that he had executed the said attachment in efforts in the hands of Thomas Pond and Merritt M. Eley and summoned them as garnishees. This day of the said Thomas Pond and Merritt M. Eley by their Attorney as the said Thomas Pond deposed that Eley in their proper persons who being sworn, the said Thomas Pond deposed that he was the maker in a Deed in Trust from the defendant to the said Merritt M. Eley which is filed in this cause and that he knows nothing of the consideration of the said Deed or any fact concerning it except eighty dollars which he saw paid, and the said Merritt M. Eley deposed that he held the property in the said deed under the same, and the plaintiff claiming the said Deed to be fraudulent, the said Merritt M. Eley by his Attorney files his plea & thereupon an issue was joined and the trial thereof is deferred till the next Court. And it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that the defendant is indebted to the plaintiff in the sum of two hundred and sixty two dollars and fifty six cents with legal interest thereon from the 23rd day of July 1820 till paid and the said defendant not appearing the solemnly called, it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover of the said defendant the said sum of two hundred and sixty two dollars and fifty six cents with interest thereon as aforesaid and his costs by him in this behalf expended.

And it is further ordered that they or such of them as may act do make a report to the Court of their proceedings herein in order to a final decree.
