At a Court of Oyer and Terminer summoned and held for the County of South-
 ampton on the 19th day of February 1821 for the trial of Caesar a negro man
 Slave the property of Sime Darden of this County, who stands charged with Larceny
 in Stealing, taking and carrying away certain property belonging to Jacob Darden of
 this County of the value of four dollars.

Present Benjamin Cobb, Silas Sumner, James D. Mapenbury, Lawrence
 Cook and William Ruggs Gent.

The Court being thus constituted the prisoner was set to the bar by the Sheriff of
 this County into whose custody he was heretofore committed and charged with the Larceny
 aforesaid, and thereupon divers witnesses were charged, sworn and examined on behalf
 of the Commonwealth touching the premises to wit, Anney the negro slave the prop-
 erty of Jacob Darden. Abram a negro man slave the property of Solomon Drury and
 Ben Duck a free man of colour. And the prisoner being fully heard by Counsel
 the Court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the case are
 unanimously of opinion that the prisoner is guilty of the Larceny whereof he
 stands charged and it being demanded of him if any thing he had or knew to
 say why the Court here to judgment and execution of and upon the premises
 should not proceed, he prayed the benefit of Clergy and to him it is allowed
 Therefore it is considered by the Court that the be burnt in the hand by the
 Sailer in open Court, which being done it further awarded by the Court that
 he receive twenty lashes on his bare back well laid on at the public whipping
 post, by the Sheriff which was also performed and proclamation being made as
 the manner is and nothing further appearing or being alleged against the prisoner
 it is ordered that he be forthwith discharged -
