Which sum added to 1775 dollars will make 1816.66. her full proportionate part of said sum right in the said negro of said acc^{ts} but that then there is to pay 75 of the expenses of the said negro being the share have left to the children in common the following slaves and their valuation say Henry valued at 100 dollars Bob 75 dollars Jack 500. Penny and child John 4.00 Jope 4.50. Agge 3.50 Hall 75, Godfrey 500. Henry 85 Charles Mervin 100. Antoin 4.50. Quincy 250 Richard 125 dollars making in all the valuation to the children of said acc^{ts} 3655.34 cents which is the remaining 2/3 of the valuation of all the slaves of the said deceased. Given under our hands this 15th day of February 1821 Henry is Vaughan, Thomas Fitzhugh Esq. Receiv^{er}. Whereupon by consent of the parties it is decreed and ordered that the report offered in form aforesaid made be confirmed and the costs equally borne between the parties.
