And it is further ordered that they or such of them as may see herein do make a report to this Court of their proceedings in order to a final decree -

Ordered that Jeremiah Cobb, William Edgington, & James Whittle let to the Court undertake the necessary repairs to the Court house of this County and such as shall be to the bar thereof as the said Commissioners may deem most advisable and when completed according to contract that they make report to this Court -

William Island Jnr. who stands charged with having feloniously murdered a negro man slave named Ben the property of the said William Island Jnr. this day appears in Court according to the condition of his recognizance entered into and thereupon the sureties from their recognizance and undertaking in this behalf are discharged, and the said William Island was set to the bar in custody of the Sheriff of this County and thereupon divers witnesses were sworn and examined on behalf of the Commonwealth touching the premises to wit James Blake (the Court summoned for his examination not having met) and the prisoner being fully heard by Council. The Court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the prisoner is not guilty of the felony wherof he stands charged, and thereupon proclamation being made as the manner is and nothing further appearing or being alleged against the prisoner it is ordered that he be forthwith discharged from further prosecution in this behalf.

William Island Jnr. who stands charged with feloniously having enclosed and kept a hog the property of Giles Reese with intent to steal the same this day appears in Court and thereupon the sureties from their recognizance and undertaking in this behalf are discharged. And the prisoner being charged with the offence aforesaid (the Court summoned for his examination not having met) divers witnesses were sworn and examined on behalf of the Commonwealth touching the premises to wit, Giles Reese, John Durham, Presley Barnes, John Nicholson, Francis Clements and the prisoner being fully heard by Council. The Court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that as an exception has been taken to the Jurisdiction of the Court in the case, that no specific felonious offence is stated in the Warrant summoning the said Court in this case to have been committed by the prisoner he is therefore discharged from the prosecution under the present warrant.
