But upon this condition that if they shall severally make their personal appearance before the Judge of our Superior Court of Law for this County at the Court house on the first day of the next Term of the said Superior Court, then and there to give such evidence as they and each of them do know on behalf of the Commonwealth against John E. Martin and shall not depart thence without the leave of the said Court then this recognizance to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue.

At a Court summoned and held for the County of Southampton on the 16th day of May 1821 for the examination of Francis Martin who stands charged with feloniously and Burglariously breaking and entering into the Store house of David Walland of this County on the 23rd day of April last past about the hour of 8 O'clock in the night of the same day with force and arms, and thereout taking, stealing and carrying away, therefrom (in specie and bank notes) between fifteen hundred and two thousand dollars, and goods and merchandise to wit, Cornbride, (two or three pieces black) Superfine blue broad cloth (two pieces, one piece of black broadway, dark huckings, one piece of Chalk, all said goods of the value of five hundred dollars, also three trunks containing wearing apparel of the value of one hundred dollars, two guns and bands and wires of the value of six thousand dollars the property of said David Walland.

The Court being thus constituted the prisoner was set to the View by the Sheriff of this County into whose custody she was heretofore committed and charged with the felony of forced and thereupon divers witnesses were sworn and examined on behalf of the Commonwealth touching the premises to wit, Augustus Pope, John M. Gurley, William Sawyer, Francis P. Williamson, David Wallace, James Milliken, William E. Daugherty, Edward Butts & Elizabeth Sumner and the prisoner being fully heard by Council. The Court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the prisoner is not guilty and thereupon it is ordered that she be forthwith discharged from further prosecution in this behalf.
