At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 21st day of May 1821.

Benjamin Cobb, James Rockwell, Jacob Durdan, Samuel Jones, Saml Dowers, William Ricks, William C Daughtery, Richard Blunt, Clements Rockwell, Wm C Daughtery, Henry Applewhite, John Peltow, and John Thomas are appointed School Commissioners for this County, and it is ordered that the Sheriff of this County notify them of their appointments and request them to meet at the Courthouse on the first Saturday in June next.

Robert Goodwyn and Henry Gurley severally produced to the Court the Sheriffs receipt for the tax imposed by Law on Ordinary keepers, and it appearing to the Court that they are men of honesty probity and good demeanor and not addicted to drunkenness and that they will keep disorderly and riotous houses of Entertainment. It is ordered that they have leave to keep an ordinary at their respective houses in this County till the first day of May next upon their giving bond with good security according to Law.

Ordered that the account of Henry Melsh amounting to nineteen dollars and forty six cents be certified to the Auditor of Public Accounts for his examination payment.

Edwards Wells produced to the Court a Certificate of his qualifications as Captain of a Company of militia in the 2^d Battalion 65th Regiment of the Virginia Militia which is ordered to be entered of record.

On the motion of John Mundall leave is given him to keep an ordinary at his house in this County till the first day of May next upon his paying the Tax imposed by Law and giving bond with good security conditioned as the Law directs. It appearing to the Court that he is a man of honesty probity & good demeanor & not addicted to drunkenness or gaming.

The Last Will and Testament of Thomas Mason deceased was proved by the oaths of Exum Bryant, and Arrington Ellis two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.
