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At a Court summoned and held for the County of Southampton on the 18th day of June 1821 for the Examination of Charles Bryant who stands charged with feloniously stealing, taking and carrying away a Bank note of five dollars of and issued from the Bank of Cape Fear North Carolina and Numbered 28, the property of Anthony Harris.

Present, Jeremiah Cobb, Benjamin Cobb, William Briggs, Jacob Darden, Francis Ridley and Silas Summerville & James Myrick. Just. Justices.

The Court being thus constituted the prisoner was set to the Bar by the Sheriff of this County into whose custody he was heretofore committed and charged with the felony aforesaid. and thereupon diverse witnesses were sworn and examined on behalf of the Commonwealth touching the premises to wit, Anthony Harris, George Powell, Doct. Charles Goddard, James West, and Alexander Myrick - and the prisoner fully heard by Counsel. The Court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the prisoner ought to be tried for the offence at the next Superior Court to be holden for this County and thereupon the prisoner is remanded to Jail.

Be it remembered that Anthony Harris, George Powell, Charles M. Goddard, James West and Alexander Myrick have in Court severally acknowledged themselves indebted to his Excellency Thomas M. Randolph Esq. Governor or Chief Magistrate of this Commonwealth in the sum of \$333.33³/4 each of their respective goods & chattels lands and tenements to be levied and to our said Governor and his successors for the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that if they and each of them shall personally appear before the Judge of the Superior Court of this County on the first day of the next term of said Court by 10 O'clock of that day there and there to give such evidence as they and each of them know or believe of the Commonwealth against Charles Bryant who stands charged with larceny and shall not depart thence without leave of the Court then this recognition to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue.
