

Governor or Chief magistrate of this Commonwealth the said Island in the sum of five hundred dollars and the said Prince and Phipps in the sum of \$250 each of their respective goods and chattels and tenements to be levied and to our said Governor and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon the condition that if the said William Island shall personally appear before the Justice of our County Court of Southampton at the Court house on the first day of the next Term by 10 o'clock of that day then and there to abide and perform the Judgment of the said Court and shall not depart thence till discharged by due course of Law then this recognizance to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till Court in course -

At a Court of Quarter Sessions held for the County of Southampton at the Court house on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of August 1821.
