The Court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the prisoner is not guilty. And thereupon proclamation being made as the manner is and nothing further appearing or being alleged against the prisoner it is ordered that he be forthwith discharged from custody.

Governor or Chief Magistrate of this Commonwealth the said Miles Wade in the sum of fifty dollars and the said Patience Wade and John Lewis in the sum of \$25. each of their respective goods and chattels, lands and tenements to be levied and to our said Governor and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth rendered. And upon this condition that if the said Miles Wade shall personally appear before the Justice of our County Court of Southampton at the Court house on the morning by two o'clock of that day then and there to answer these things whereof he stands charged and abide & perform the order or Judgment of the said Court, and shall not depart thence till discharged by due course of Law then this recognizance to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue.
