The Court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the case are unanimously of opinion that the prisoner is guilty. Therefore it is ordered that he be taken from hence to the place from whence he came and from thence on Saturday the 29th of September next between the hours of ten o'clock A.M. & four o'clock P.M. of that day to the place of execution and there be hanged by the neck till he is dead.

Memo. The Court value the said slave to six hundred dollars - and from all the circumstances attending the trial of the prisoner recommended to the Executive to commute his punishment to transportation.

Ordered that the Owners of the Poor bind Joshua & Catherine to Jane Burr according to Law.
