

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the seventeenth day of September 1821

Present. Benjamin Devaney James D. Massenburg & Grant
James Myrick & Alexander P. Deane

Ordered that the Estate of William W. de? which remains undistributed by the former administrator be committed to the hands of George Ames Sheriff of this County, and that he administer thereon according to Law

Ordered that the account of George Ames Sheriff amounting to \$194.80 cents. The account of George Ames Sheriff amounting to \$11.52 another account of George Ames Sheriff amounting to \$36.52. The account of Henry Kerley Sailer amounting to \$136.69 and the account of James Rockwell Clerk amounting to \$30.50 cents be referred to the Auditor of Public accounts for his examination and payment

Ordered that William J. Smith, Thomas Williamson & Arthur Williamson or any two of them do examine, state and settle an account current of Abner P. Smiths administrator of Francis Harris's estate and make report thereof to Court

On the motion of Henry R. William who made oath and together with Arthur Williamson Joseph Harris John Barbour & Thomas Maxwell his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of forty thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs certificate is granted the said Henry R. William for obtaining letters of administration on the Estate of Joseph Williams de? in due form

Ordered that Lewis Thorpe, William Lundy, Aaron Adams & John Inry or any three of them being sworn before a Justice of the Peace do appraise all the personal Estate of Joseph Williams de? and return the appraisement under their hands to Court

On the motion of Mary Thorpe and for reasons appearing to the Court it is ordered that the order of the last Court appointing John Barbour Guardian to the orphan of Aaron Thorpe de? be rescinded. And in the further motion of the said Mary Thorpe the mother of the said infant orphan she is appointed Guardian to the said infant, and thereupon the said Mary Thorpe with Arthur Williamson & John Reus her securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of fifteen hundred dollars conditioned as the Law directs

Miles Williams, William Whitfield Judge & Joel Williams an infant by Miles Williams his next friend

Edley Williams & Britton Bryant Tutor of Nathan Williams de? vs. J. P. de?

On the motion of the defendant Bryant It is ordered that William Bryant, David Barnett & William Phillips the Court appointed to make division of the land & slaves belonging to the Estate of Nathan Williams de? be summoned to the next Court to make a report of their proceedings under the former interlocutory decree

Elas Sumnerell Guardian to James Dole this day returned an account of his said wards estate which was examined and approved of by the Court & ordered to be recorded

The Executors named in the last Will and Testament of Thomas Mason de? having refused to take upon themselves the burden of the Executor of the said Will, and no person appearing to take administration on his Estate. It is therefore Ordered that the Estate of the said Thomas Mason de? be committed to the hands of George Ames Sheriff of this County and that he administer the same according to Law

On the petition of John Argubart who produced the Sheriffs receipt for the tax imposed by Law and entered into and acknowledged a bond with security in the penalty of one hundred and fifty dollars conditioned as the Law directs, a license is granted him to keep an Ordinary at his house (formerly cell) till the first day of May next. The Court being satisfied that the said John Argubart is a man of good character and not addicted to drunkenness

On the motion of James Jones a free man of color And it appearing to the Court that the said James Jones has unavoidably lost the certificate of his emancipation. Therefore it is

ordered that the Clerk of the Court do issue a new certificate of his emancipation on the Law directed

Henry Briggs deputy of the Court do issue a new certificate of his emancipation on the Law directed for the year 1820 also a list of the Parish of St. Luke for the year 1820 and ordered to be entered
