This day came the parties by their Counsel and the Commissioners appointed by the Interlocutory decree made at December Court 1820. to make sale of the land therein mentioned this day made the following report to wit: "In obedience to a decree of the Honorable Court of Southampton to us directed bearing date Dec Court 1820 we have proceeded to make sale of the lands whereof Charlotte Turner dec'd was seized and possessed with, in fee simple on a credit of twelve months, to wit: "one tract of land containing seventy three fourth acres it being a tract of land purchased of James Myrick Esqre the same being purchased by Newt Harris for three hundred thirty, and dollars 6 1/4 cts. Also one other tract of land which the said Charlotte Turner dec'd purchased of Thomas & Mabry Midge containing seventy & three fourth acres which the said Newt Harris became also at two hundred and twelve dollars 25 cts. - We then proceeded to divide the amount of the sales of that two tracts of land in five equal parts and have paid over to each distributee share as in the bill mentioned their proportion of the amount of sales of the said lands - Given under our hands this 29th day of December 1820 Levi Waller, Peter Edwards, David Westbrooke." Whereupon by consent of parties it is agreed & ordered that the report aforesaid in form aforesaid made be held firm and stable and former bidding between the parties and that the costs be proportionally borne between the parties -

This day came the parties by their Counsel the Commissioners appointed by an Interlocutory decree made in this cause at December Court 1820 to make division of the land therein mentioned this day made the following report to wit: "In obedience to a decree of the Honorable Court of Southampton to us directed bearing date Dec Court 1820. we have proceeded to carry the same into effect to wit, being attended by the County Surveyor we proceeded to divide the land belonging to Thomas Turner dec'd which the late Charlotte Turner his widow held as dower in five equal parts having regard to quality as well as quantity and do assign unto James Myrick in right of his wife Phoebe Lot N^o 1. containing sixty three & a half acres bounded as follows beginning in Barrows road at the corner of branch thence down the road to Ducks Ford road, thence along that road to a post at the corner of an orchard, thence along a line of marked trees to the said branch and up the runs of the said branch to the beginning it being his proportion of the said land - We allot unto Henry R. Sullivan in right of his wife Charlotte Lot N^o 2. containing eight acres beginning at a post on the south side of Ducks Ford road a corner of James Myrick & wife's line thence along the said road to a post and in Martha Turners line opposite the gate thence along a line of marked trees to the said branch, thence up the said branch to James Myrick's & wife's line thence along his line to the beginning it being his proportion of the said land - We allot unto Martha Turner Lot N^o 3. containing six acres beginning at a post in Henry R. Sullivan's line on the side of the road thence along the said road to a walnut tree in Newt Harris' line thence along his line to a peach tree a corner, thence along a line of marked trees to a sweet gum in Henry R. Sullivan's line thence along his line to the beginning it being her proportion of said land - We allot unto Newt Harris in right of his wife Elizabeth Lot N^o 4. containing sixty six & a fourth acres beginning at a walnut tree in Martha Turners line
