And by consent of parties it is ordered that the said Nathaniel D Land give the said Levi Rochelle good counter security the bond for which purpose is to be in the penalty of twenty thousand Dollars, and conditioned as the Law directs

This day this cause came on, on the bill, answer &c: when it is decreed and ordered by the Court that James Scammell, William Briggs, George Hines, James Little, and Frederick Feltz or any three be commissioners to sell to the highest bidder on a credit of twelve months the negroes of which Ann Hines died, seized, which were devised to her by her husband John Hines dec^d having first duly advertised the time and place of sale, and take six separate bonds for the same with good security and assign one to Robert Birdsong - one to Edwin Hines, one to Isaac Hill, one to Samuel Scarborough, one to Temperance Hines and one to Nancy James, and that they report in order to a final decree

Temperance Hines and Nancy James Complain^t
against
Samuel Scarborough, Lydia his wife, Isaac Hill & Milly his wife, Edwin Hines & Robert Birdsong in right of his wife Peggy & Ann Hines dec^d Def^s

This day this cause was docketed by consent of parties and with the assent of the Court when it is ordered and decreed that George Hines, James Scammell, Frederick Feltz, William Briggs and James Little or any three be Commissioners to divide the negroes and other estate of which Ann Hines died, seized and possessed in kind if the same can be effected if not that the said Commissioners after having advertised the time and place do sell to the highest bidder the slaves and land aforesaid upon a credit of twelve months, take six bonds with good security for the same and assign one bond to Robert Birdsong in right of his wife Peggy, one to Isaac Hill in right of his wife Milly, one to Edwin Hines, one to Samuel Scarborough in right of his wife Lydia, one to Temperance Hines and one to Nancy James and that they make report to this Court in order to a final decree

An Inventory and Appraisement of the Estate of John Barnes dec^d was returned to Court and ordered to be recorded

Upon the petition of William Bailey for leave to alter Bailey's road. This day came the said petitioner in his proper person, and the persons appointed to view the way for the said road to view this day made their report in these words "In conformity to an order of the Honorable Court of Southampton dated August 1821 and to us directed we have proceeded to view the lands through which the contemplated road is to be altered called Bailey's, leading from Porters Bridge to broad water road, and we believe the alteration will be of public utility and no private injury" "Given under our hands this 15th day of November 1821. Jere Cobb, Justices." Whereupon it is ordered that the petitioner have leave to alter the said road, as petitioned for, and that the old road be discontinued
