

At a Court summoned and held for the County of Southampton on the 3^d day of December 1821 for the examination of Harrod Dole who stands charged with feloniously stealing, taking and carrying away five sheep the property of David S. Boykin of the value of ten dollars from the possession of the said David S. Boykin on the 22^d day of June last past.

The Court being thus constituted the prisoner was set to the bar by the Sheriff of this County into whose custody he was heretofore committed and charged with the felony aforesaid, and thereupon depositions were sworn and examined on behalf of the Commonwealth touching the premises said David S. Boykin and the prisoner being fully heard by counsel. The Court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the prisoner ought to be tried for the said offence at the next Superior Court of Law to be held for this County.

Be it remembered that Harrod Dole with Jesse Bailey and Patrick Dole his securities have in Court severally acknowledged themselves indebted to his Excellency Thomas M. Randolph Esq. Governor of this Commonwealth the said Harrod Dole in the sum of one thousand dollars and the said Jesse Bailey and Patrick Dole in the sum of five hundred dollars each of their respective goods and chattels lands and tenements to be levied and to our said Governor and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that if the said Harrod Dole shall personally appear before the Judge of the Superior Court of Law to be held for this County on the first day of the next Term to answer an Indictment to be preferred against him for the felonious stealing aforesaid and shall not depart thence without the leave of the said Court then this Recognizance to be void or else to remain in full force.

Be it remembered that David S. Boykin here in Court acknowledged himself to be indebted to his Excellency Thomas M. Randolph Esq. Governor of this Commonwealth in the sum of \$353¹/₂ of his goods and chattels lands and tenements to be levied and to our said Governor and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that if the said David S. Boykin shall personally appear before the Judge of our Superior Court of Law for Southampton County on the first day of the next Term by A. C. Black of that day then and there to give such evidence as he knows against Harrod Dole who stands charged with felonious stealing and shall not depart thence without the leave of the said Court then this Recognizance to be void or else to remain in full force.
