An Account Current of James Davis Est. was this day returned to Court and ordered to be
 recorded.

Minimfred Druw, Union and relief of James Druw ac. and Next, Servant
 & James Parker infants by Minimfred Druw their Guardian and next friend J. H. H.

This day came the parties by their counsel, and the persons appointed to divide the lands of
 which James Druw ac. died seized, under an interlocutory decree made in this cause on the day of
 December 1821. this day made their report in these words to wit: "Agreeable to an order of the
 County Court of Southampton to us directed bearing date December first 1821. with the undersigned
 have gone on the lands of James Druw ac. attended with the County Surveyor as by the order we
 were required and upon a fair survey of the same there appears to be in the whole tract 200 acres
 and agreeable to the will of the said ac. we have assigned to Minimfred Druw Union and relief
 of James Druw ac. one third of said land in quantity, having no regard to quality as the
 order of the Court seems to correspond with the will. Which donor is bounded as follows to wit:
 Beginning at a white oak a corner of Humphry Druw's and a new corner of the Dorris line
 thence S 76° 11' 40" poles to a stake a c. of Joel Harris' thence N 22° 39' 1" poles to a small B.
 gum ex of Humphry Druw's thence S 77° 6' 13" poles along a small branch thence S 17° 56' 6"
 poles to the first Station. containing 12 acres, thence beginning at the same white oak and
 running N 73° E 112 poles to a lightwood tree a c. of Humphry Druw's thence S 2° 11' 26"
 poles to a B. gum new lot made in Charles Harris' line thence along a new dividing
 line N 85° W 105 poles to a c. post in Mrs. Druw's line thence along the same N 3°
 W 85 poles to the 1st Station. containing 50 acres added to the 12 as above makes 62 acres
 being the Dorris of Minimfred Druw in said land. And further in obedience to the
 same decree we have proceeded to sell at public sale the balance of said land which was
 138 acres and Minimfred Druw became the purchaser at 3.50 per acre amounting to
 447.50 dollars, and taken it in four bonds of \$119 dollars each to wit, one bond to Jesse
 Druw, one to the Next Druw, one to the Servant Druw and one to the James Druw
 all of which bonds are of equal amt. to each of the 3rd children being their full proportion
 of the sale of the lands aforesaid. And also in further obedience to 2^d decree
 we have proceeded to divide all the slaves of J. ac. in manner and form following to wit:
 To Minimfred Druw Union of James Druw ac. one negro woman Priscilla valued at 300
 dollars, and a negress woman Sarah which she sold for 266 dollars before the division amounting to
 566 dollars and Servant Druw Let N. 1 pays to Minimfred Druw 50 dollars for
 her keeping old negress woman Sarah makes in all 616 dollars being her one fifth part
 of all the slaves of J. ac. valued lacking \$101.00 which sum she the said Minimfred Druw
 refused to receive from the children. therefore the said sum of \$101.00 is divided among
 the children aforesaid. Also Let N. 1. pay Davy valued at 150 dollars & Mason valued
 at 275 dollars amounting to \$425 drawn by Servant Druw his part of slaves of J. ac.
 ac. after paying to Next Druw Let N. 3. 7.50 and to Minimfred Druw one fifth the
 sum of \$425. which sum deducted from 725 dollars leaves \$667.50 his full proportionable
 part of J. ac. slaves. Also Let N. 2. drawn by James Druw pay Wingo valued at 300
 dollars Rose 225 and Martha 160 dollars making 685 dollars his full part of said slaves
 after paying to Let N. 4. 17.50 which deducted from 685 dollars leaves 667.50 his part of
 said slaves. Also Let N. 3. drawn by Next Druw pay Lucy valued at 300 dollars
 Peter at 200 dollars, and Mariah at 160. dollars makes 660 dollars his proportionable
 part of said slaves after receiving from Servant Druw, Let N. 1. the sum of \$7.50.
 which sum added to 660 dollars makes 667.50. his full proportionable part of all the
