This day this cause came on to be heard on the bill and answer when it is ordered and decreed that Jacob Barnes, Ebenezer Holt, Lewis Morrill and John Barnett or any three of them be commissioners and attended by the County Surveyor, to divide the lands of which Lemuel Nick died, seized & possessed lying and being within the County in the following manner, Viz, that they divide the lands into three equal parts and assign six months to Exum Nick in his own right and from the purchase money by the said Exum Nick from Joseph Reese Jr. & Patience his wife, and from the purchase money Catharine his wife. And that the said Commissioners sell the other three months to the highest bidder upon a credit of twelve months after having duly advertised the time and place of the same, and take three separate bonds with good security for the same and assign one bond to Polly Nick one to Ann Nick and the remaining one to Celinda Nick, and that they report to the Court in order to a final decree.

An Inventory and Appraisement of Ann Hines est. was returned to Court & ordered to be recorded

This day came the parties by their Counsel and the Commissioners appointed under an interlocutory decree made in this cause on the day of January 1824 to make division of the slaves of which James Hines died seized and possessed this day made their report in these words to wit: "According to a decree of the County Court of Southampton we have divided the slaves of which James Hines died seized and possessed in the following manner Viz. First we have assigned one third part thereof to Temperance Hines as her dower, namely, Ned, Phillis, "Matthew", and Amos valued at \$1650. - We have also divided the remaining two thirds into three equal parts, and assigned one third to Miles Scarbrough in right of his wife Delilah "Annab", Pierce and Dennis valued at \$470. - One third to Richard Hines - Arny, Ket and "Anabine" valued at \$390. The remaining third to John Hines valued at \$400. - Temperance Hines to pay to Richard Hines \$225. and pay to John Hines \$11. and Miles Scarbrough to pay to Richard Hines thirty eight dollars and nine cents. Given under our hands this 17th day of December 1824. Jas. Scammell, John Williams Clerks." Whereupon by consent of parties it is decreed and ordered that the report aforesaid in manner & form aforesaid made be held firm and stable forever. And that the costs of this suit be proportionably borne between the parties.

The last Will and Testament of William Gay dec. was proved by the oath of Etheldred Wapser and John P. Mangrum two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be read, and on the motion of William Sperry the Executors therein named who made oath and together with John Davis and Etheldred Wapser his deacons entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs certificate is granted the said William Sperry for obtaining a probat of the said Will in due form.

Ordered that John Nick, Jesse Crocker, Thomas Capell, and John R. Mangrum a jury three of them being sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of William Gay dec. and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.
