And the defendant John Saunders not having entered his appearance and given security according to the act of Assembly and the rules of this court and it appearing to the satisfaction of the court that he is not an inhabitant of this Commonwealth therefore it is ordered that the said defendant appear here on or before the third monday in May next and answer the complainant's bill, and that a copy of this order be forthwith inserted in the Petersburg Intelligencer for eight weeks successively and posted at the front door of the courthouse of this county on two several court days.

Amos Pope is by the court appointed surveyor of the road from the Swamp near Whitehead meeting house to Nathan Pops and it is ordered that the hands of Thomas Newman under the control of Anthony Muller, the hands of Nathan Pope, Richard Darden, John Pope, Richard W. Day, the hands of Ethelred Edmunds where Benjamin Faircloth lives and others who formerly worked on said road attend and keep the same in repair when required according to Law.

This cause was this day heard on the bill, answers, exhibits filed and arguments of counsel and it appearing to the satisfaction of the court that the order of Publication heretofore awarded against the above defendants John Whitfield and Lucy his wife and Melton Jenkins has been inserted in a newspaper published in the Town of Petersburg and posted at the front door of the courthouse according to the provisions of an Act of Assembly in such case made and provided and the debts due against the above defendants except such as have answered having been regularly served and they having failed to answer as to them the said bill is taken for confessed. Whereupon and after due consideration thereof had the court doth adjudge, order and decree that the tract of land lying in this county containing three hundred and twenty five acres conveyed by Valentine Jenkins in his lifetime by the deed filed in this cause for the purposes therein mentioned be sold at public auction for the best price that can be had for the same in cash to the amount of John Merguhat's claim and the balance on a credit of twelve months to be secured by bond with good security, twenty days public notice of the time and place of sale being first given, and that the debt mentioned in said deed to be due to the plaintiff John Merguhat to wit \$324.11 subject to a credit in the hands of Henry Briggs debtor of Valentine Jenkins, with interest thereon till paid from the 22^d day of March 1804 and the costs of this suit be satisfied out of the proceeds of the sale, and the balance if any be paid over to the heirs at Law of said Valentine Jenkins according to their respective rights. And it is moreover ordered that Edward Rutte and Silas Sumner do carry the foregoing part of this decree into effect and make a conveyance in fee simple to the purchaser or purchasers of said land and make a report to this court of their proceedings hereon in order to a final decree.
