1818. to make division of the lands in the bills mentioned the day made a
report in the following words to wit. "Agreeably to the above decree of the
Honorable Court of Southamptown to us directed, we the undersigned attorneys
by the County Surveyor, have proceeded to make distribution of the lands of
which Mrs. James and her heirs in the following manner, to wit, To Nancy
James the widow as her dower we have assigned the mansion house together
with 197 acres as also 120 acres lying on Nottmurray River (commonly
called Carys old place) To Mrs. Davis widow of Edmund Davis dec'd the land
commonly designated the island plantation, Conty 46 1/2 acres and to pay bills
Nos 1, 2, 3, 5 each the sum of thirty three dollars. To Elizabeth James dec'd
No 4 Conty 257 acres; To John James Conty 257 acres, To
3rd Saml James Conty 257 acres & To Amos Drake containing
24 1/2 acres, and to the heirs of Robert James Lot No 4 containing 230 acres
which makes in valuation of land after adding the advancements made
to Amos Drake & the heirs of Robert James dec'd each the sum of \$1024
reference to the plat of the County Surveyor which we make a part
of our report. The particulars may more fully appear - Given under our

the information of Wells Marfee & Samuel Story two of their body
Also William H. G. Surveyor of the road leading from flat swamp
near Capt. Guss to the County line on the 18th of this present month
March for not keeping the same in lawful repair on the informa-
tion of Thomas James one of their body sworn in Court & sent to give
evidence. Also James Johnson for living notoriously and publicly
