The plaintiff by Counsel moved the Court to take up this cause which motion was overruled by the Court -

This day came the parties by their Counsel and the Commissioners appointed by an interlocutory decree made in this cause on the day of November 1818, to make division of the land and negroes in the proceedings mentioned made their report in the following words to wit. " Agreeably to an order of the County Court of Southampton to us directed bearing date the 1818. we the undersigned have gone on the three different tracts of land nam^d or known by the house plantation, the Blake tract and the Barton tract, of Henry Baron dec^d attend with the County Surveyor as by the order we were required and have run out all the said lands and find as follows: The house plantation 778 acres, in the Blake tract 335 acres, and in the Barton tract 181 acres - making in all 1294 acres. We then proceeded to divide each tract among the legates in manner and form following Viz, Lotⁿ N^o 1. containing 136 acres drawn by Richard Baron in the Home plantation and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a white oak post standing at the cr. of the fence at the fish road, thence N 85 W 160 poles to a black jack a cr. in Briddle line standing on the side of the road: thence N 38 W 75 pole to the road call'd Hales road, thence along that road 94 poles to a red oak thence N 84 E 26 ³/₄ pole to a persimmon tree a cr. in the widest part of the said land, thence N 33 E 56 poles to a gum near the ruddy meadow a new cr made in lots N^o 4 & 5 thence along the dividing line of lots N^o 1, 3 & 4 & 5 to the first station, being his proportionable part of the tract as above stated. Also Lotⁿ N^o 2 drawn by Henry Baron containing 170 ³/₄ acres in the said Home plantation and bounded as follows. To wit, Beginning at a new cr. in lots N^o 2 & 3 thence S 34 E 20 pole to the branch call'd Rose branch
