The defendant West who is out of this country and against whom the plaintiff has proceeded in the manner prescribed by law against absent defendants still failing to appear and answer the plaintiff's bill. On motion of the plaintiff by his counsel the court doth take his bill for confessed as to that defendant. And the cause coming on to be heard as to the other defendant, on the bill, was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof, the court doth adjudge, order and decree that the defendant West pay to the plaintiff the sum of forty four dollars with Interest thereon from the 27th day of March 1821 till paid together with his costs. And that the defendant Daughtry pay to the plaintiff out of the funds in hands belonging to the defendant West, if so much remains after deducting his costs, the full amount of this decree -

Clements To Richard H Baker for \$500:00

Mariah To Edwin G Hart for 200:00

Alfred To Edwin Harrison for 125:00

from which we have deducted 5 p. c. Commissions \$825:00

leaving a distributable balance of \$783:75

which sum of \$783:75 we have divided amongst the several distributees as by the said decree we are directed to do.

To Edwin G Hart in right of his wife \$87:09

To Edwin Harrison and Mary his wife 174:16 1/2

To James Dillard Guardian to Elizabeth Dillard 174:16 1/2
