This day came the parties by their Attornies and the Commissioners appointed by an interlocking day made a report in the following words to wit.
In obedience to an order of the Honorable Court of Southampton County the undersigned Commissioners have divided the lands and negroes belonging to the Estate of Byra Lundy dec'd. the quantity, and has assigned Lot No. 1. to William Lundy containing two hundred & twenty two acres. Lot No. 2. to Byra Lundy containing three hundred and eleven acres and also divided the negroes belonging to said estates into 2 equal parts and have allotted to William Lundy one negro man Dick and one negro man Nat & to Byra Lundy one negro man George and one negro woman Maria. Given under our hands the first day of January 1821 - J. C. Lundy, Erwin Adams & George Inay. Whereupon by consent of parties it is decreed and ordered that the report aforesaid in manner and form aforesaid made be held firm and stable forever and that the costs of this suit be proportionally borne between the parties.

Ordered that the Sheriff of this County make sale of Isaac Munday, David Munday, Dempsey Artis, James Woodson, Henry Turner, Burwell Williams free negroes according to Law for the payment of their Taxes & levies.

Eli Coker is appointed Surveyor of the road from the new Bridge over the Ogemus sock Swamp to Ruffins Bridge, and it is ordered that the male labouring tythables of Richard Klor, at his plantation in this County, at the plantation of James R. Murgant, of Jane Briggs and William Norworthy do assist him in keeping the said road in repair.

William Briggs is by the Court appointed Surveyor of the road from the County line to the new road, and it is ordered that the male labouring tythables of the said Briggs, Burwell Barnatt, Temperance Hines, Miles Searbrough, Eley Coker and Mary Stanton do assist him in keeping the said road in repair.

The Court doth assign Jesse Hart Guardian to Mary Hart orphan of Richard Hart dec'd. and thereupon the said Jesse Hart together with Jesse Bailey & Benjamin Washington his securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of one thousand dollars conditioned according to Law.

A Deed of Gift from James Edwards to William Edwards having been admitted to record in the Clerk's Office since the last Court was this day returned to Court & ordered to be recorded among the proceedings of the day.
