It is therefore ordered that Henry McLaughan, Henry Burley, and James Rochelle, or any two of them being sworn by a Magistrate, examine and view the lands through which the road will run, and report to the Court the conveniences and inconveniences, that will result as well to the public as to individuals if the said road shall be turned as proposed -

This day came the parties by their Counsel and the persons appointed to make partition and division of the land in the proceedings mentioned this day made a report which is ordered to be recorded, and is in the following words and figures to wit:
'Agreeable to an order of the County Court of Southampton to us directed bearing date August Court 1821 and amended May Court 1822 we the undersigned have gone on the lands that James Jones purchased of Nelson Wade in his lifetime and finding there to be 178 acres in the whole tract, we have proceeded to lay off and assign to Patience Wade widow and relict of Nelson Wade dec^d as her dower for life thirty acres of the same, including the houses and orchards, which dower is assigned to her by proper metes and bounds, in manner and form following to wit:
Beginning at a gum a new br. made in a small branch, running thence along Mills Griffins line N 84 E 44 poles to Apple Tree new br. of Griffin and the dower. thence S 70 E 30 pole to a post a new br. of James Jones & Mills Griffin. thence S 30 E 80 poles to small oak new br. made in Smt. Stantons line thence along Stantons line to the edge of Charles old pond, so called, thence along the run of that branch to the first station. being her proportionable part of S. land for life. Given under our hands this 17th day of June 1822. By: Griffins, Carr Bowers.' Whereupon by consent of the parties it is decreed and ordered that the report aforesaid in manner and form as aforesaid made be binding between the parties, and that the costs of this suit be proportionably borne between the said parties -
