This day came the parties by their Attornies and the persons appointed to make partition and division of the land and negroes in the proceedings mentioned this day made their report which is ordered to be recorded and is in the words and figures following to wit.

"Agreeable to a decree of the County Court of Southampton bearing date December Court 1821. We the undersigned Commissioners have gone on the lands of Edmund Turner dec. lying and being in the County aforesaid attended with the County Surveyor as by the order we were required, and have run out and surveyed the same and find there to be in the house plantation 301 acres on the north side of the mill pond. 322 1/2 acres on the south side of S. Millpond & 47 1/2 acres drowned land making in all of the home plantation 671 acres 47 1/2 of which being covered with water we did not think proper to take any notice of in the valuation. 248 acres in the Laughan Tract & 397 acres in the Brantley Tract making in all 1316 acres valued to be worth five thousand five hundred and ninety five dollars 14 cents out of which lands we have assigned for
