

Narcissa Turner widow of Edmund Turner dec. 322 1/2 acres valued at \$5.00
 1/2 acre, making eighteen hundred and sixty five dollars, her proportionable part of
 5th in this county during life. which down right we have assigned her out of the
 home plantation agreeable to the requisition of d. decree, which said down lies on
 the Southside of the aforesaid Mill pond, and bounded as follows. to wit.
 Beginning at the intersection of the Spring branch of Mill pond thence up
 the Spring branch the various courses thereof to a post a cr. of Jarrell Turners
 line, thence S 49 W 76 poles to a sweet gum a cr. of Willie Francis thence S 87
 E 60 poles to a post oak a corner of Willie Francis, thence S 65 W 12 poles to
 another post oak a cr. of Willie Francis, thence S 6 E 70 poles to the run of the
 flat swamp, thence down the run of the said swamp the various courses thereof
 to the intersection of Locks Swamp and the flat swamp; thence up the various
 courses of Locks Swamp to the mill pond dam, thence along the edge of mill pond
 up to high water mark to the first station, being her full proportionable part of
 all d. lands as her dower for life; also further in obedience to the decree aforesaid
 we have allotted to the said Narcissa Turner widow of Edmund Turner dec.
 one third hole dish of corn that may be grown this date obtained or arise from the
 mill of d. dec. as her dower for life in the mill aforesaid. Therefore the balance
 of all the lands of said deceased and mill aforesaid is left agreeable to the decree
 aforesaid to be rented out in common and the money divided among the two
 legates of said dec. namely James Turner and Elizabeth Henry Turner infant
 children of Edmund Turner dec. Also in obedience further to the said decree
 we the Commissioners aforesaid have proceeded to lay off, value and assign to the
 Widow Narcissa Turner widow of Edmund Turner dec. the following negroes
 to wit, Say negro man Authur valued at 387 dollars David 362 dollars
 London 375, Louisa 250 Sunny 350 Patience 300 & Patience 5: 100 dollars.
 making in the whole valuation of the widows dower of negroes for life, making
 in the whole valuation 2124 dollars being one third part in value of the
 negroes of d. dec. out of which lot being lot No 3 of d. negroes, the said
 Narcissa Turner widow of Edmund Turner dec. do pay to Lot No 2 one dollar
 which leaves to her one third part in valuation for life 2123 dollars her full
 proportionable part of d. negroes. And the other two thirds are left agreeable to the
 decree aforesaid to be hired out in common, for the benefit of James Turner &
 Elizabeth Henry Turner infant children of Edmund Turner dec. The profits
 arising from the said hires to be equally divided between them agreeable to
 the requisition of the decree aforesaid, being done as we think in order to aforesaid
