Absent Jeremiah Cobb Present Silas Sumner & Co.

The Commissioners appointed at the last Court to devise a plan for building
a Clerk's Office for this County, this day made their report which is ordered to
be recorded and is in these words to wit: "In pursuance of an order of the
County Court of Southampton bearing date June Court 1822, we the
Subscribers, being three of the Commissioners appointed by said order have
met on the public ground on the 21st day of this month June, and after
taking into consideration the building of a Clerk's Office for this County,
report the most eligible site in our opinion on the public ground to be
near the foot of the bridge under or near a large elm tree, and that
we have drawn a plan for said Office which we think most advisable
and estimated the probable amount of building the same, which is here
annexed as a part of this our report. And we further report that in order to
prepare the ground where the said Office is proposed to be situated it
will be necessary to run a brick wall about one hundred feet in length
and from four to five feet in height, and the ground levelled by filling
up some sinks &c. and a ditch cut to drain the land below the said wall
towards the river - that the probable amount of expenses attending the
building said wall and filling up said sinks will be two hundred dollars
All which is respectfully submitted to the Court. Given under our
hands this 21st day of June 1822. Jere Cobb, James Rochelle, Henry Briggs
Whereupon it is the opinion of this Court that it is expedient to build the said
Office and it is ordered that the Sheriff summon the Justices of this County
to attend on the first day of August Court next for the purpose of taking
the subject into consideration -
