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the same report, and it is further ordered that James Ingham, Henry Gurley, Henry H. Laughman and James Rockwell or any three of them let to the lowest bidder who building of the two bridges over the outlets or savans making from the river over which the said road will pass and make report thereof to the Court.

An Indenture of bargain and sale from Richard S. Sandford and Henry his wife to Alexander Myrick was proved by the oath of Parker Barnett, Richard Borden and Evans Pope the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.

Levi C. Summell here in Court refuses longer to act as Constable in the upper district of Mattomay Parish and desires that his resignation may be entered of record which is accordingly done.

The report of the Commissioners presented at the last Court, recommending a plan for building a Clerks Office and the repairs of the public ground &c was received by the Court, and it is ordered that James Rockwell, Henry Briggs, Jeremiah Cobb, James D. Massenburg and Carr Boners or any three of them be a committee to let the same at public or private contract as they may see proper and that they take bond and security of the contractor for the performance of the same agreeably to the said report - and the said Jeremiah Cobb is appointed to Superintend the same, and it is his duty to see that no materials should be used about said building but such as he thinks are proper and of good quality, and if any difference should arise between the contractor and the said Jeremiah Cobb it is to be decided by a majority of the committee, and that the said work shall be done at such seasons of the year as he the said Jeremiah Cobb with a majority of the committee shall think best, and the same is to be completed by the first day of June next.

Lewis N. Branch is appointed Constable in the upper district of Mattomay Parish in the room of Levi C. Summell resigned and thereupon the said Lewis N. Branch together with Richard Black and Bennett Holmes his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, which bond is ordered to be recorded, and the said Branch took the oath of Fidelity to the Commonwealth, the oath to support the Constitution of the United States, the oath to suppress duelling and the oath of office.
