have gone on the lands of Goodman Branch dec'd. in the County of Southampton, and being attested with the County Surveyor, we have proceeded to run out and survey the out bounds of the lands, and find there to be in the whole tract of s<sup>t</sup>. ac<sup>d</sup>. three hundred and five acres of land. We then proceeded to apply to Elizabeth Branch widow and relict of Goodman Branch dec'd. as her donee for life, her one third part in value, having regard to quantity as well as quality in s<sup>t</sup>. land, which lower right is bounded as follows To wit. Beginning at the gate post that leads to the dwelling house made a new corner in the down and James P. Urquhart, thence S. 28° W 117 poles to a small gum a new cr. of the down and James P. Urquhart, standing in the run of the lightning swamp. thence up the run of the said swamp the various courses thereof another gum a new cr. made in the down and S<sup>t</sup>. of P. Urquhart, thence 8 145 poles to a small pine a new cr. made up the down and said P. Urquhart's pt. of said land. thence S 82° W 28 poles to the first station containing 40 acres, being her full proportionable part of all the lands of her s<sup>t</sup>. husband, which will more fully appear by having reference to the plan annexed to this report. Given under our hands this 25<sup>th</sup> day of July 1822.

Whereupon by consent of parties it is decreed and ordered that the said report in manner and form as aforesaid made be confirmed, and that the defendant hold the land allotted to her for and during the term of her natural life.

This day came the parties by their attorneys and the Commissioners appointed to make division of the land in the proceeding mentioned this day made a report which is ordered to be recorded and is in these words. To wit. "Agruably to a docket of the County Court of Southampton bearing date January Court 1822 and hence annexed, we met on the land belonging to the estate of Amos Washington deceased as mentioned in the said decree, and with the assistance of the County Surveyor we have divided the said land into four equal parts, having respect to quality as well as quantity, and have allotted it in the following manner to wit. To John Washington lot #1 containing one hundred acres bounded by the lands of Goodman Branch, Sept Bailey & Dife Washington, the said John to pay his brother William the sum of £. To Dife Washington lot #2 with the dwelling house theron containing one hundred acres, bounded by the lands of John Washington, Sept Bailey and William Washington and John Urquhart, the said also to pay his brother Joseph the sum of £.
