 and the account of John Crumpler jr. amounting to \$2.50 cents be severally certified
 the Auditor of Public accounts for his examination and payment.

On the motion of Thomas Prillon who made oath and together with Joseph
 Prillon, Robert Prillon, Oswin Ricks and Robert Ricks jr. his securities entered
 into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of fifty thousand dollars conditioned
 as the law directs certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration
 on the estate of Joshua Prillon deceased in due form.

Ordered that Robert Prillon, Joseph Prillon, Edwin Delk, and John
 Harris or any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace
 for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of Joshua Prillon dec^d and
 return the appraisement under their hands to court.

The last Will and testament of Horrell Bass dec^d was proved by the oath of
 a witness thereto and having been before proved by the
 oath of also a witness thereto is ordered to be recorded.

On the motion of John Pond who made oath and together with Hank
 Pond and Patrick Pond his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in
 the penalty of seven thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs certificate is
 granted the said John Pond for obtaining letters of administration on the
 estate of Peter Pond deceased in due form.

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
