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Ordered that Ethelreda Cooper, Leonard Pond, Richard Kille, and Robert Raulings or any three of them being sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do open and appraise all the personal Estate of Peter Pond dec^d and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

The Court doth assign Sally Everett guardian to Peter Pond's estate, and she with the said Sally Everett together with Collier W. Barnes and Lawrence Cook her securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of two thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs.

Ordered that Benjamin Cobb, Edwards Maults and John Williams or any two of them do let to the lowest undertaker the repairs to the Appomattox Bridge, and when the same is completed according to contract make report thereof to Court.

Ordered that John Williams be appointed Surveyor of the road from the Run Tavern to the fork of the road near Mr. Collins in the room of Benjamin Cobb discharged, and that the male labouring tythables that usually work thereon assist in keeping the said road in repair.

Ordered that Robert Pruller, Joseph Pruller and Byrd Harwell or any two of them let to the lowest undertaker the repairs of the little swamp bridge, and when the same is completed according to contract make report thereof to Court.

Ordered that Robert Pruller be appointed Surveyor of the road from the ham bar or branch to Proctor's bridge in the room of Joshua Pruller dec^d and the male labouring tythables that usually work thereon assist in keeping the said road in repair.

Ordered that the Overseers of the Poor for the upper district of Northern Neck be and are Alexander Davis, Dicy Davis and Martha Crocker poor persons according to Law.
