By agreement of Edmund L Day - We have by the above named order, attended with the County Surveyor gone on the lands of said John M L Day and divided the said land as follows. Beginning at a pine running 40 pole to a new corner of Richard Days line, thence due East 234 pole to a pine a corner in John Barnes line, thence along the said Richard Days line to the beginning, containing 28¹/₂ acres being his proportion of the tract above stated. We assign unto John A Turner Lot N^o 1 containing 45 acres Beginning at a pine in John Barnes line, thence along Richard Days line 78 pole to a corner in said Days line, thence South 18 West to a new corner made in the out boundary, thence along the out boundary to the beginning - We assign unto Edmund L Day Lot N^o 2 containing 34¹/₂ acres it being his proportion of said land, bounded as follows. Beginning at a black oak in the out boundary, thence along the said old line to a new corner of John A Turner, thence along his line 60 poles to a new corner in said Turner line, thence S 82 D. W 70 poles to the out boundary, thence along the out boundary to the beginning, it being his proportion of said land. We assign unto Nathaniel Rochelle in behalf of his wife Frances Lot N^o 3 containing 42¹/₂ acres bounded as follows. Beginning at a new corner of Richard Days in the old line thence along the said line to Edmund Days line thence along the said Days line to John A Turners line, thence along the said Turners line to Rich^d Days line, thence along his line to the beginning it being his proportion of said land.
