"In pursuance of an order of the County Court of Southampton, we the undersigned three of the Commissioners named in said order, in pursuance thereof, have let to the lowest undertaken the building of a Clerk's Office in compliance with the annexed plan and report, to be completed on or before the first day of June 1822 and that Clements Rochelle became the undertaker at the price of fourteen hundred and eighty five dollars who gave bond with James Rochelle his security which is hereto annexed. And we also report that it is the opinion of the acting Commissioners that it would be advisable to change the site of the said Office so as to have the old Store house on the public ground taken away and the Office set on a situation so that it may be connected with a new Cornhouse when the Court should think proper to build one, or at least place it in a situation more contiguous to the present Cornhouse. all which is respectfully submitted.
