

Fanny Porter this day appeared in Court according to the condition of her recognizance to answer the complaint of James Porrell against her for a breach of the peace. Whereupon the said James Porrell being sworn and examined and the said Fanny Porter being fully heard it is the opinion of the Court and accordingly ordered that the said Fanny Porter give security for her good behavior for the term of twelve months that is to say himself in the sum of fifty dollars with her securities to be bound with her in the sum of twenty five dollars each, and thereupon the said Fanny Porter together with Jacob Porter and Jacob Williams her securities here in Court severally acknowledged themselves indebted to Thomas M Randolph Esquire Governor or Chief Magistrate of this Commonwealth the said Fanny Porter in the sum of fifty dollars and the said Jacob Porter and Jacob Williams in the sum of twenty five dollars each of their respective goods and chattels, lands and tenements to be levied and to be paid said Governor and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that if the said Fanny Porter shall keep the peace and be of good behavior towards all the citizens of this Commonwealth and especially towards the said James Porrell for the term of twelve months from this day then this recognizance to be void.

The Court doth assign Christian Lawrence guardian to Mary Carr orphan of Abraham Lawrence deceased and thereupon the said Christian Lawrence together with Jonathan Luter and Schuchray his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of two hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs.
