

and the remainder of his estate to the said Jordan by the said Testator (appears) for the same reason doth adjudge, order and decree that the aforesaid tract of land lying in this County which is stated and admitted by the parties not be worth three thousand dollars a share be sold on a credit of twelve months and the proceeds of the sale to be secured by bonds with approved security to be divided in the following manner one ninth part to each of the Complainants Richard, Thomas and Jesse Porter and Britton Faison and Susan his wife in right of his wife and Weller Luter and Polly his wife in right of his wife, to the defendants Matthew Underwood, Polly Underwood and Nancy Underwood one ninth part and one fourth of one ninth, and the remaining fourth of one ninth to Elizabeth Underwood the widow of Jordan Underwood and another to the deceased infant Ethelred Underwood, and that a good and sufficient conveyance in fee simple be made to the purchaser or purchasers of said land. It is moreover decreed and ordered that three fourths in value of the slaves which were given in the will of Matthew Underwood to his wife during her natural life or widowhood be equally divided between the Complainants Richard Porter, Thomas Porter, Jesse Porter, Britton Faison, and Susan his wife in right of his wife, and Weller Luter and Polly his wife in right of his said wife, and that the remaining fourth as they cannot be divided in kind be sold on a credit of twelve months and the proceeds of the sale to be secured by bonds with approved security, be divided in the following manner, one fourth to each of the defendants Matthew Underwood, Polly Underwood and Nancy Underwood and one fourth of one fourth to be equally divided between the same and the said Elizabeth Underwood as heirs at law of the deceased infant Ethelred Underwood, and it is moreover ordered that Henry B. Blougham, John T. Blaw, Jacob Williams, Thomas Newsome and Henry Gurley or any three of them do carry the foregoing decree into effect and make a report to this Court of their proceedings herein in order to a final decree -

On the motion of James Jackson it is ordered that he have leave to keep an Ordinary at his house, formerly Muddalls, till the first day of May next on his paying the tax imposed by Law and entering into bond with sufficient security in the Clerks Office conditioned as the Law directs. It appearing to the Court that the said James Jackson is a man of good character and not addicted to drunkenness or gaming -
