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adjudge, order and decree that the complainant Hester Boykin as devisee of her deceased husband be invested with the possession of that half of his plantation which lies to the north of the pen branch together with the still thereon to be held by her during her natural life according to the line mentioned in the will (the other half together with the reversion of this half belonging to the estate of the said John Boykin dec'd). It is further ordered that the defendant David H. Boykin as Executor of the said Daniel Boykin deceased do deliver to the said Widow the negro girl Cate in the will mentioned such horse belonging to the estate as she may select a riding chair a feather bed and furniture of her selection two cows and calves of her choice two chest and two sows and pigs to be held by her in fee simple also a negro man named Ben to be held by her during her natural life. It is further ordered that the said Executor do turn over to himself as administrator of John Boykin dec'd the four negroes bequeathed to him by the said Testator and one bed and furniture second choice also two hundred and fifty dollars in money to be raised out of the assets in his hands proceeding from the sales of the perishable estate or otherwise. It is further ordered that the said Executor make sale of all the rest of the personal estate of his testator except the slaves left to Daniel Boykin the younger and which lapsed by his death) on a credit of twelve months taking bond and good security from the purchasers and out of the proceeds after paying the debts which may be due from the estate of his testator pay one third of the surplus to the said widow and the residue to himself as administrator of the said John Boykin deceased. It is further ordered that Silas Sumner, Arthur Holman, John Crumpler Sen. and John Urquhart or any three of them do appraise the three slaves which the testator bequeathed to his son Daniel and alltho one third in value to the said Widow to be held for life and the other two thirds to the administrator of the said John Boykin deceased and report their proceedings in the premises to this Court in order to a final decree -
