This cause was this day docketed by consent of parties and a part of the Court and was heard on the bill, answer, exhibits filed and argument of counsel whereupon after due consideration thereon the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that from and after the day of next the defendants heirs at law of Burwell Mann succeed to be concluded of their equity of redemption in the tract of land conveyed in the Deed of Mortgage and that in the mean time they have the privilege of redeeming the same by paying the principal and interest of the debt due to the Plaintiff James Scott and the costs of this suit, and it is further decreed and ordered that if the tract of land aforesaid is not redeemed on or before the said 15<sup>th</sup> day of December next, that James D. Mapenbury, Jesse Lankford and Carr Morris and William Joyner or any two do first lay off one third of the same and allot it to the said Henry as her dower, and that they or any two of them after giving ten days previous notice of the time and place of sale expose the said tract of land including the reversion dependant upon the dower estate and the articles of personal property mentioned in the said Deed of Mortgage to public sale for cash. That they out of the proceeds of the sale pay to James Scott the sum of twenty seven pounds eleven shillings and two pence with interest thereon from the last day of October 1796 till paid subject to a credit of eighteen dollars and fifty six cents paid 17<sup>th</sup> day of July 1809 and sixty three dollars thirty eight cents paid the 2<sup>d</sup> day of May 1810 and that they pay over the surplus if any to the defendants the children of the said Burwell Mann dec<sup>d</sup> equally or the guardian of the infants. It is further ordered that the aforesaid Commissioners or such of them as may act do make a deed of Conveyance to the purchaser of said land and make a report to the Court in order to a final decree.
