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not having been set aside it is considered by the Court that the same be made final and that the plaintiff recover against the defendants and Charles W. Borden for their appearance bail the sum of forty dollars with legal interest thereon from the 1st day of January 1821 till paid the debt in the declaration mentioned and his costs by him in this behalf expended. And the said defendants in mercy &c.
