The last Will and Testament of John Musson deceased was proved by the oath of John Spencer and of the witnesses thereto -

Ordered that John E. Mason be allowed the sum of twenty five dollars as a fee for his services in defending a negro man slave named Scipio the property of Henry Duprie of Greensville. charged with Burglary

The last Will and Testament of Thomas Williamson deceased was proved by the oath of John M. Lenoire and Littleton Williamson two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. and there being no Executor named in the said Will on the motion of Benjamin Williamson who made oath and together with George Frey, Arthur Williamson and Littleton Williamson his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs certificate is granted the said Benjamin Williamson for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of the said Thomas Williamson deceased with his Will annexed in due form -

Ordered that George Frey, Henry R. Gilliam, Joseph Harris and William Lundy or any three of them being duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal Estate of Thomas Williamson deceased and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

William Crumpler having obtained an attachment against the Estate of Pleasant Crumpler who is removing out of this County privately or absconding or conceals himself that the ordinary process of Law cannot be served on him for four pounds five shillings and four pence with interest from the 8 day of April 1811 for debt and the Constable having made return that he had levied the said Attachment on "one mare, cart, wheels, gear, & falling chair" This day came the said William Crumpler by his attorney and the said Pleasant Crumpler being solemnly called and not appearing to reply the said property for reasons appearing to the Court the said Attachment is continued till tomorrow.

Patrick Swinton who stands bound by a recognizance for his appearance here this day to answer a complaint against him for a breach of the Peace appeared accordingly and being heard it is ordered that the complaint against him be discharged.

Cesar a negro man the property of Jesse Gardner of this County was this day set to the bar by the Sheriff of this County into whose custody he was heretofore committed and charged with stealing a pig the property of Jesse Gardner and divers witnesses were sworn and examined on behalf of the Commonwealth touching the premises and the prisoner fully heard by Counsel. The Court from all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the prisoner is not guilty of the felony whereof he stands and thereupon procla
