Richard Whitehead is by the Court appointed Surveyor of the road from William Newtons to Swift Harris in the name of Richard Porter dec^d and it is ordered that the male labouring tycheables that have usually worked thereon assist in keeping the said road in repair.

William A Common & Nelson Forest severally produced to the Court the Sheriffs receipt for the Tax imposed by Law on Hawkers and Pedlars of foreign growth or manufacture. Therefore it is ordered that they severally have a license to retail goods, wares and merchandize of foreign growth or manufacture within this County till Southampton May Court next.

Ordered that Charles Kirby and Mary Ann his wife, which said Mary Ann is the Executrix of William Whitehead dec^d, be summoned to appear here at the next Court to render an account of their administration on William Whiteheads estate.

The Court doth assign Schabed Johnson Guardian to his infant son James Johnson and therefore the said Schabed Johnson together with Matthew Gardners and Jordan Edwards his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five hundred dollars conditioned as the Law directs.

Ordered that Clements Rochelle, Willis Womble and Edwin B Hart or any two of them do let to the Court undertaker the repairs of the bridge across the head of Allens mill pond and when the said repairs are completed according to contract make report thereof to Court.

Ordered that the Estate of Edmund Blythe dec^d be committed to the hands of the Sheriff of this County and that he administer thereon according to Law.

Ordered that John Moore, Samuel Wallace, Thomas Johnson, and James Whitehead or any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal Estate of Edmund Blythe dec^d and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

On the motion of Elizabeth Alcorn who filed her bill, an injunction is awarded her to injoin and inhibit Thomas Johnson, her agents, attorneys and all others concerned, from removing, or causing or permitting to be removed, or sent out of the limits of this Commonwealth the slaves in the bill mentioned named Moses & Sam and a negro woman and her children until the further order of the Court. And unless the said defendants shall enter into bond, with sufficient security before the Officer who executes this process, payable to the plaintiff in the penalty of two hundred and eighty three dollars and ninety two cents conditioned to have the said slaves forthcoming to abide any future order or decree of the Court in relation thereto then the Sheriff of the County or Sergeant of Corporation in which the said slave may be found is directed to take possession of them and keep them until such bond and security be given or until the further order of the Court to the contrary.
