This day came the parties by their Attornies and the persons appointed by an order of the day of November 1822 to make sale of the slave therein mentioned this day made their report which is ordered to be recorded and is in these words, to wit: "In obedience to the within decree of the Court aforesaid we have proceeded to sell at public auction the negro woman Esther within named, who sold for the sum of two hundred and eighty five dollars. for which amount we have taken two bonds as directed exclusive of costs & expenses (with good security) and assigned one of the said bonds to Robert Rawlings Guardian to the defendant Peggy Barnett, the remaining bond we have in our hands subject to the further order of the Court. There be no legal guardian of the complainant William Henry Denson. Which is respectfully submitted to the Court. Given under our hands this 18th day of February 1823. Math Calvert, Henry Briggs -
Whereupon by consent of parties it is decreed and ordered that the report aforesaid in manner and form as aforesaid made be held firm and stable and binding forever between the parties -
