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performed according to contract, and should any difference arise in opinion between the contractor and the said Jeremiah Cobb that then the same shall be settled by a majority of the said Commissioners. And it is considered by the Court that the said Job be placed in the rear of the old jail on such side as the said Commissioners may think most advisable.

James Murdaugh is by the Court appointed Constable in the lower district of Newbury Parish.

Ordered that Richard Blunt be added to the persons heretofore appointed to appraise Ann Hamis's estate and that any three of them make report.

Ordered that Benjamin Cobb, John Williams, Jeremiah Cobb & Edwards Rutledge or any three of them do let to the lowest undertaker the repairs of the Appomattox Bridge and make report thereof to Court.

On the motion of Simon Murfer and it appearing to the Court that the Commissioner of the Revenue has committed an error in the land and lot list to him. It is therefore ordered that he be charged with taxes on the following lots only in the Town of Manassas to wit. N^o 10. 12. 14. 18. 19 & 25 and one hundred and ninety nine acres of land in Saint Luke Parish - which is ordered to be certified to the Auditor of Public accounts.

Ordered that William E Daughtry be appointed to keep the weights and measures of this County and that Alexander F Fute deliver the same to the said Daughtry.

It appearing to the Court that the Clerk's Office lately built for the County is completed according to contract (except a small part of the painting which is to be completed by the contractor) Therefore it is ordered that the same be received.

Ordered that William E Daughtry, Henry Gurley and James Rochelle or any two of them sell to the highest bidder the old storehouse standing on the public ground which sale is not to take place until the present occupant shall remove thereat provided such removal shall take place within two months from this day which said sale or contract is to bind the purchaser to remove the said house within such time as the said Commissioners may think fit, and also to bind the purchaser to remove the rubbish and level the ground whereon the said house now stands.

Ordered that William E Daughtry, Henry Gurley & James Rochelle or any two of them rent out the old Clerk's Office so soon as the Clerk shall remove thereat until June Court next.

On the motion of William Simmons who produced the Sheriff's receipt for the tax imposed by Law on Ordinary keepers a license is granted him to keep an Ordinary at his house till the first day of May Court next on his giving bond

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
