Matthew Culbert and George H. Gentry severally gave bond and security as
Constables in the lower district of Saint Luke's parish and qualified according to Law
John Moore & John Davis severally gave bond and security as Constables in the
lower district of Newbury Parish and qualified according to Law
Lucas A. Branch gave bond and security as Constable in the upper district of
Newbury Parish and qualified according to Law.

Ordered that Bolling M. Barnes, Richard M. Day, Hanson Lope and Evans Lope or
any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that pur-
pose to appraise all the personal estate of Benjamin Faircloth deceased and
return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till Court in course.
