Consent and upon the argument of Counsel. For consideration whereof the Court doth order, adjudge and decree that Lem Bowers, William Syner, and John Moore or any two of them, do divide the slaves in the bill mentioned to wit Sonica, Betty, Isham, Sally, Rachel and Fanny and the increase of the females of them, and allot to the complainant, one fifth part thereof, to the guardian of the defendants Jacob and Nancy two fifth parts, and to the guardian of the defendants William and Louisa the remaining two fifth parts, and the Court perceiving from the kind of property to be divided and the number of claimants, that difficulty may arise in making the division above directed, doth further, adjudge order and decree, that the said Commissioners or such of them as may act, if necessary, do sell at public auction for cash one or more of the said slaves and with the proceeds of the sale make the division aforesaid and make a report thereof to the Court in order to a final decree. And it is further ordered that the plaintiff recover against the defendants his costs by him about his suit in this behalf expended.

The Court doth assign William Hill guardian to his infant children William and Betsey Hill and thereupon he together with William Ferguson & Dixon Ferguson his securities entered into and acknowledges a bond in the penalty of one thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs -
