On the motion of Peter Edwards administrator de bonis non with the will annexed of William Battle dec'd it is ordered that Master Commissioner Holt examine the state and settle an account current of Nathan Harris administrator on the said estate and make report thereof to Court -

Ordered that the account of Lillian Moore amounting to \$5.66 cents be certified to the Auditor of Public accounts for his examination and payment

The persons appointed to view the way proposed for turning the road leading from Wells Murfrees to Louche quay through the plantation of Elias Edwards this day made a report in the following words to wit: "Agreeable to the annexed order we the undersigned have proceeded to view the premises and find in our opinion that the public will not be injured by the road being turned, where it is payed for, provided it is put in good order, and a Arch Bridge be put across a Swamp which is in the route of the new road and be kept in repair by the said Elias Edwards. Given under our hands this 15th day of Sept. 1823. J. Murfee. A. L. Edwards. Wells Murfee." Whereupon it is ordered that the Stationer have leave to turn the said road according to the said report, and that the old road be discontinued -

Robert Gray who stands bound by recognizance for his appearance here this day to answer the complaint of William H. Briggs against him for a breach of the peace this day appeared accordingly. And thereupon the said William H. Briggs was sworn and examined and the said Robert Gray fully heard it is the opinion of the Court and accordingly ordered that the said Robert Gray find security for his good behaviour towards all the citizens of this Commonwealth for the space of twelve calendar months from this day, himself to be bound in the sum of five hundred dollars with two securities in the sum of \$250 each, and in default thereof that he be committed to jail -

Whereupon the said Robert Gray with Edwin Gray and Thomas H. Gray his securities here in Court severally acknowledge themselves indebted to his Excellency James Pleasants Esq. Governor or chief magistrate of this Commonwealth and his successors in office for the time being himself in the sum of five hundred dollars and his said securities in the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars each of their respective goods and chattels lands and tenements to be levied and to the said Governor and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that if the said Robert Gray shall keep the peace and be of good behaviour towards all the citizens of this Commonwealth more especially towards H. H. Briggs of this County for the term of twelve calendar months from this day then the above recognizance to be void and to remain in full force -
